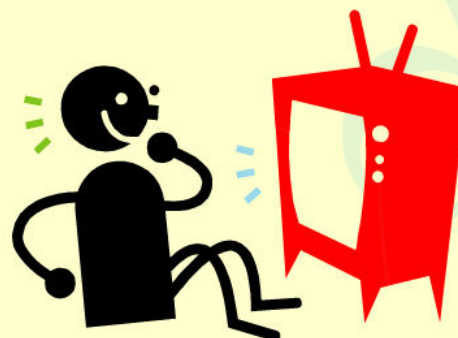

The film *Black Swan* had its world premiere as the opening film at the 67th Venice Film Festival on 1st September 2010. Being screened around the world, *Black Swan* was very well received by audiences and it became an outright winner in the 2011 Oscars, winning a total of five awards. Natalie Portman (leading actress) won the Academy Award for the Best Actress in a leading role.

The story starts with Nina's (Natalie Portman) dream. She had the craziest dream about a girl who turned into a swan, creating a chill feeling for the audience at the very beginning. After that, the scene moves to a studio where the director of the New York City Ballet Company, Thomas (Vincent Cassel) is planning to put *Swan Lake* on the stage again. This time, however, the story is different, involving two swans - the white swan and its evil twin, the black swan.

Nina has always hoped to become the Swan Queen so badly. But Thomas thinks that her rigidity is only suitable for acting the white swan and not the black swan. At this point, Nina's psychotic symptoms begin to loom up.

In the hope of performing their best, the two ballet dancers in the film, actresses, Natalie and Mila Kunis, did six-months of ballet training before they played their roles. As a result, their acting in the film is flawlessly elegant.

Moreover, Natalie did a really great job of acting as a psycho. It is definitely not an easy task, but her actions, such as scratching her back and the expression shown when she heard the laughter from her illusion, do make her seem like a real psycho.

What makes the film more enchanting is the soundtrack. The classical music that everyone must have heard is *Swan Lake* by Tchaikovsky. It's almost as if it has been created for the film's bracingly intense plot. The music, combined with the stunning moves of the actors, makes the film perfect.

Being a psychological thriller, *Black Swan* shows the extremity and insanity of human beings aptly and there is no doubt that though it is supremely creepy, at the same time, it is eerily graceful.
