## **Purpose**

We commit to organizing and arranging a wide range of life-wide learning (LWL) activities to enhance students' learning effectiveness, which helps to broaden their learning experiences outside the classroom and enhance their sense of belonging to the community. Various types of career and counseling activities are organized to develop students' potential for the purpose of whole-person development. Students with financial needs can be partially funded to make sure that they enjoy equal opportunities to join the activities as the other students in the school. All S.1-S.6 students who have participated in extracurricular activities organized or recognized by school and meet one of the following criteria may apply for the subsidy. There are two subsidy schemes available for application as follows.
